THE IMPORTANCE OF A PROXY



Our Annual Meeting will be held on September 12th. At this meeting, we will be having an election for 4 board **positions**. As most of you know, our Board of Directors is made up of homeowners elected by fellow homeowners. The Board is responsible for enforcing the rules and regulations, our budget, working with our management company, signing off on contracts that require spending our HOA funds and so much more that impact you as a homeowner. This election coming up in September can only occur if we reach a quorum for the meeting. If we do not have a quorum, we do not have a meeting. To that end, UPA will be mailing out an annual meeting packet with information on what will take place at the meeting, candidate forms to be used if you are interested in running for a board position and a proxy form. Proxy forms are important if you do not plan on or simply cannot attend the meeting. It is particularly important that you assign your proxy to someone who is a homeowner here in the neighborhood whom you trust to cast your vote during the election. Carefully consider who that would be and return your completed proxy to UPA.

DO YOU NEED TO SUBMIT AN ARB APPLICATION?



This is a frequently asked question amongst homeowners. The answer is probably yes. If you are making any exterior alterations to include adding a new room to your home, a new front door, landscape edging, new shed, fencing or a new pool for example, you will need to submit an ARB application to UPA. The application will then be reviewed by the Architectural Review Board.

Epic Summer Salad By Cassie Best



Ingredients

- 400g black beans, drained
- 2 large handfuls baby spinach leaves, roughly chopped
- 500g heritage tomatoes, chopped into large chunks
- ½ cucumber, halved lengthways, seeds scooped out and sliced on an angle
- 1 mango, peeled and chopped into chunks
- 1 <u>large red onion</u>, halved and finely sliced
- 6-8 radishes, sliced
- 2 <u>avocados</u>, peeled and sliced
- 100g feta, crumbled
- handful of herbs (reserved from the dressing)

For the dressing

- large bunch mint
- small bunch coriander
- small bunch basil
- 1 fat green chili, deseeded and chopped
- 1 small garlic clove
- 100ml extra virgin olive oil or rapeseed oil
- 2 limes, zested and juiced
- 2 tbsp white wine vinegar
- 2 tsp honey
- **STEP 1** Make the dressing by blending all of the ingredients in a <u>food processor</u> (or very finely chop them), saving a few herb leaves for the salad. You can make the dressing up to 24 hrs. before serving.
- **STEP 2** Scatter the beans and spinach over a large platter. Arrange the tomatoes, cucumber, mango, onion and radishes on top and gently toss together with your hands. Top the salad with the avocados, feta and herbs, and serve the dressing on the side.

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
